# Sisters Servants Elect New Superior General





Delegates travelled from Australia, Brazil, Canada, Poland, Serbia, Slovakia, Ukraine and


the United States. Although the General Chap-

The next 11 days and nights, were filled to the brim with deliberations, conferences, presentations, individual sharing as well as small and large group discussions. Each province gave a presentation about their status,

community life and ministry. It seemed that one common thread ran through each presentation: the issue of aging and the lack of vocations. However, the common bond of hope and faithfulness to our vows of consecration, and the charism of Josaphata, prompted us to look at the need to venture in the future with the willingness to risk and respond to the needs of society today.

Although the Chapter was a time of business, and the discussions were not always pleasant and agreeable, the time of recreation was truly life-giving during the days of Chapter. It was amazing to see these women, who run hospitals, schools, communities, let their hair down and enjoyed having fun, as witnessed in the picture of "musical chairs."

Finally, on July 24th began the voting for the new Superior General and her Council. We know that the Holy Spirit was working over-time, as for the first time in our Congregation's history, the sister elected as Superior General was not a delegate at the Chapter, which meant that the Chapter was suspended until Sr. Sofia Lebedowicz from our province in Poland arrived in Rome! The General Councilors elected next were Sr. Bonifatia Dakiv from Ukraine, Sr. Janice Soluk from Canada, Sr. Mykola Ctepac from Serbia and Sr. Luiza Ciupa from Brazil. Mnohaya Lita!
